The Brown Palace Hotel and Spa, a Denver landmark since 1892, will be getting a face-lift starting this spring — a three-year project to restore the stone facade.

Managing director Marcel Pitton said the iconic hotel will continue normal operations during the project.

Denver-based Building Restoration Specialties Inc. — which specializes in masonry restoration, preservation and conservation of historic buildings — will be replacing extensive amounts of stone, hand carving custom-ordered Utah sandstone for each piece.

Over the last three years, BRS has restored the stone structures at Denver's Civic Center Park and its Greek

amphitheater, the City and County Building and the McNichols Building.
