Trybas to receive Dana Crawford historic preservation award

The annual Dana Crawford Awards for Excellence in Historic Preservation will be presented to David and Stephanie Tryba on May 22 by Colorado Preservation Inc. at a ceremony at the Denver Botanic Gardens.

The Dana Crawford Award is Colorado's largest statewide preservation award, honoring individuals and organizations that have made a significant contribution toward preserving Colorado's built history.

The award's namesake is Dana Crawford, a pioneer in saving historic buildings, many that were viewed as eyesores, and in proving that their restoration makes economic sense.

David Tryba is being honored for transforming historic buildings and sites into what he terms "modern contextual urbanism" through his firm Tryba Architects. Stephanie Tryba is being recognized for her leadership and support to multiple preservation-minded organizations, serving on various boards and committees. The couple restored the William G. Fisher Mansion at 1620 Logan St. in Denver to serve as Tryba Architects' office and their family residence. The Trybas host numerous events for philanthropic organizations at their home each year.

The 2012 State Honorees are Rhonda Maas of Building Restoration Specialties in Lake City, and Matthew Prythero, who was chosen as the Outstanding Youth Preservationist.

The awards ceremony will kick off with a cocktail reception at 5:30 p.m., followed by the awards presentation at 6:30 and a cocktail buffet at 7:30 p.m. For more information about tickets or sponsorships, visit www.coloradopreservation.org

AWARDS: The Colorado Restaurant Association presented its highest honor, the Richard P. Ayers Award for Distinguished Service, to Mary Mino, president of the CRA Education Foundation, at its annual Industry Spotlight Awards event. Since joining the CRA Education Foundation in 1997, Mino has overseen Colorado ProStart, which has an enrollment of about 800 students in 26 high schools across the state, and further developed the scholarship program. She also helps produce events such as Denver Food and Wine and the foundation's Scholarship Awards Luncheon.

Kevin Lofton, president and CEO of Arapahoe County-based Catholic Health Initiatives, was named one of the "Top 25 Minority Executives in Healthcare" by *Modern Healthcare* magazine, a national business publication. He's appeared on all four of the biennial listings of top minority executives in the United States since the weekly magazine began the roster in 2006. Lofton ranked No. 45

DONE DEALS: Centennial-based Comcast Media Center announced that the NHL Network has signed on to use its Advertising Distribution Network (ADN) to deliver promotional spot advertising to its affiliates. ADN currently delivers advertising and cross-channel promotions for more than 220 TV networks and advertising organizations. The cloud-based service is used by 16 of the country's largest cable TV operators.

Adrenalin, the Brand Expansion Team added three clients in its push to expand into the outdoors market and into digital branding strategies. The Denver agency's new clients are PMI Ropes in Denver, which manufactures safety ropes for climbers, emergency rescue personnel and the military; Schwab Cycles in Lakewood, a family-run business that supports cycling events, and is staffed by cyclists and service pros certified to work on all bicycle makes and models; and Spindaroots, a Denver company that provides children's cycling wear.

CVI, a 46-year-old, family-owned Denver company, aligned with Milestone Software to form WebbStone LLC, which will be the exclusive seller of Milestone Software products. Milestone has created a Customer Relationship Management software in the cloud that Milestone CEO Rebecca Robbins calls "cutting edge ... It's so solid we can put any industry on top of it." She said the beta testing was done by the Denver law firm Minor & Brown PC. Milestone has raised almost

\$600,000 in angel investments, according to Robbins.

OPENINGS: ViaWest (www.viawest.com), one of the largest privately held data center, cloud computing and managed services providers in North America, is opening its new corporate headquarters at 6400 S. Fiddler's Green Circle, Suite 2000, in Greenwood Village. Gov. John Hickenlooper is expected to be on hand for the April 19 ribbon-cutting ceremony. Founded in 1999, the company will employ between 80 and 90 people at its new headquarters, which formerly was in the Tabor Center downtown.

GBA (www.gbateam.com), an engineering and architectural firm based in Kansas, opened an office at 12303 Airport Way, Suite 105, in Broomfield.
